stroke. The second round would prove to be an uphill battle. The Tigers were led by freshman Miya Promwongsa, who shot 77 & 74 for a two-day total of 151. That score would qualify her as fourth overall and a selection to the All-State Team. The Tigers battled but couldn't quite get the edge



and fell to a 329 team score on day two for a tournament team score of 645. The eventual champion was Mt. San Antonio College, who posted a 631, with Modesto finishing second with a 638. The Tigers had another fantastic season overall, winning the NorCal Regional and the Big 8 championship. Sophomore Ethel Asequia was named the Big 8 Conference Champion.
