ALLEN NAMED NFL'S BEST

Buffalo Bills quarterback Josh Allen (Reedley College quarterback, 2014) was named the National Football League's Most Valuable Player at the league's annual awards show February 6. The NFL Honors program was held at Saenger Theatre in New Orleans, the host city of Super Bowl 59. Allen continues to be one of the top



five players in the NFL, with 41 total touchdowns (28 passing, 12 rushing, 1 receiving), 3,731 passing yards, and 531 rushing yards in 2024. He edged out Baltimore Ravens quarterback Lamar Jackson for the award. Allen has now played seven seasons in the NFL, with over 26-thousand yards passing and more than 4,100 yards rushing for his career.
